

Common Colds Drugs

Mucus congestion of the upper respiratory tract results in an infection called a cold.

These drugs are used to suppress symptoms such as fever, postnasal mucus drip, cough, nasal mucus congestion, malaise, and headache and body ache.

No single drug can suppress all the symptoms.

Therefore, it is believed (no science evidence) that a combination of drugs can treat all the cold symptoms.

Combination mixtures of drugs in fixed ratio forms are

"Less than effective (do not work)", Combinations are irrational and have the disadvantage of multiple side effects.

The labels for the use of cold remedies are misleading, dubious and use non-medical terms such as "cold medicine".

The label should name the specific symptoms that they treat.

The combination cold remedies are "shot gun" formulas sprayed at many symptoms or poly drugs that claim to treat all symptoms, but in reality they treat none because they do not work.
